## Invitation to attend the 2010 Fall Meeting of the Swiss Chemical Society

On behalf of the Swiss Chemical Society (SCS) and the Organizing Committee, we are pleased to invite you to participate in the 2010 Fall Meeting. Following the tradition of alternating locations for this event, the ETH Zurich is proud to host this year's Fall Meeting for the first time at its Science City (Hönggerberg) campus.

Ian Manners (Bristol), Karl Wieghardt (MPI für Bioanorganische Chemie, Mühlheim), and Philip P. Power (UC Davis).

At the Commercial Exhibition, more than ten companies will be presenting their products and services. In addition, there will be a Job Fair with company representatives providing information on career opportunities.

We are grateful to the Swiss Chemical Industry for its continued sponsorship. All of the eight Parallel Sessions will have an endowment. Other sponsors have made very generous general financial contributions (Lonza, Swiss Academy of Sciences), or financed the awards for the best posters and best oral presentations (DSM, Metrohm Foundation). This support from industry extends beyond the financial aspect; it is also an expression of the interest of industry in our research activities, many of which are carried out by young scientists.
